FROM YOUR BOARD CHAIR, Douglas Kranig

Greetings Seymour Residents,

Have you had enough winter? Seems like it was a long one. But here comes spring to refresh us.

- The EPA through the WI DNR requires the Town obtain a permit for storm water run off. The permit requires that we educate residents to inform them that rain water run off contains pollution from oil leaks or spills, garbage dumped in ditches and other pollutants which are carried into the streams and lakes. So we ask that all of you make an effort to keep pollutants out of our streams and lakes. Take your garbage to the landfill and cover your load on the way. Thanks!
- The landfill accepts residential garbage only from Seymour residents with a permit at no charge. If you bring anything other than household garbage, you will be charged the landfill tipping fee.
- Please remember to use the library wisely. The Town pays over \$80,000.00 per year to allow our residents to use the library. It is helpful if you only check out those items you plan to use. Thank you for your cooperation.
- Dogs running at large continues to be the leading call I get. Please keep your dogs under your control so your neighbors do not have to call me.
- We plan to reconstruct at least two (2) miles of road again this year. We will indicate which ones at the Annual Meeting. See you there!
- After much negotiation, the Towns surrounding the City of Eau Claire
 have completed an inter-governmental agreement related to land use.
 We signed the agreement in February and it will be effective once the
 Towns have amended their Comprehensive Plans. We will be appointing
 a plan commission to administer our Comp Plan after the April election.
 We will be holding a hearing on the amendment to the Comp Plan after
 our plan commission is in place. The Board feels good about our reaching
 this agreement with the City as it will allow us to have more say in how
 land is divided/used within the three mile extra territorial limits of the
 city.

Your Town Board and Staff are committed to our goal of providing excellent services to those we serve - our Residents. Contact me or another Board Member if you have an idea, suggestion, comment or complaint. Enjoy the spring!

April 5, 2011 is the SPRING ELECTION. Local school board members, Town of Seymour Board members, Eau Claire school district referendum and a Justice of the Supreme Court are this ballot. The local elections are extremely important - please take time out that day to vote. We will be here from 7am until 8pm. As a reminder, please turn off your cell phone prior to entering the Town Hall. Thank you.

Do you have a DOG? If so, it needs to be licensed within the Town of Seymour. The tags are good from January through December. That means the tag expires in DECEMBER. Please renew your tag before I send you a reminder in March. By that point your tag has been expired for three months. Anytime a mailing goes out (like reminder letters) it is an expense to the town. Set a goal to renew your tags on time in December of 2011. Please remember we require the "PROOF OF RABIES VACINATION" to issue you a tag.

Board of Review in early summer... Our "Open Book" meetings are held with Bowmar Appraisal assessors. These meetings are open to the public to view and discuss any property values within our Town. Approximately two weeks after Open Book meetings, we hold a two hour meeting for anyone wishing to contest their values. This is called "Board of Review". At this meeting you are required to "prove" why your property should be at a lower (or higher) value. Anyone interested in these meetings and needing more information can call me. DRIVEWAY ACCESS

To allow emergency vehicles access to your property for fire protection and ambulance service, please keep your driveway clear of low hanging tree branches and obstructions. It is also important to have adequate width to accommodate these vehicles. Thank you.

DOG LICENSES

A dog more than 5 months of age must be licensed. It is the **resident's responsibility** to license their dog. The State requires Proof of Rabies Vaccination EACH year. This does not mean your pet needs the vaccination every year. Please bring your <u>CERTIFICATE OF RABIES VACCINATION</u> from the vet to prove your dog's shots are current. No need to make copies as we use it for the receipt and return it to you. <u>LICENSES EXPIRE EACH YEAR ON DECEMBER 31</u>. New license tags are available starting December 1 each year. The fee for neutered/spayed dogs is \$7.00 and for dogs not neutered/spayed the fee is \$18.00. Late fees of \$5.00 are charged beginning April 1st --- Ordinance #80-3. Citations will be issued beginning June 1st for unlicensed dogs. The cost of the citation is \$50 plus court costs which are currently \$165. Please be prompt with licensing your dogs.
