Greetings Residents!

As we head in to a new year, we are excited for what 2023 has in store for us. This past year brought many reasons to celebrate as well as new opportunities for our residents. As most of you have heard by now, we were awarded a federal broadband grant in conjunction with Bloomer Telephone Company, with work to begin this spring. Funding is a combination of Federal PSC funding, Bloomer Tel. Co., and the Town's ARPA funds. It will ensure that every home in our township will now have high speed internet available - something that many of us have needed for a very long time. Ahead of Bloomer's start, we also saw Spectrum move into our area, digging in and hanging lines out in our more rural stretches. While our partnership and commitment is to Bloomer Tel. Co., we welcome another option for our residents to choose from.

Summer brought lots of music to our area: Nashville North concerts as well as our favorite summer event, FeverFest! We're already looking forward to this year's event at the end of August, which will also include our third annual Seymour Town Picnic. This picnic is everything I love about our town - bringing our neighbors together to have a good meal, hang out, and just have a good time with our families, while being made possible by contributions from almost every business that calls Seymour home. Mark your calendars now for August 23rd!

It goes without saying that a final negotiated agreement with the Seven Mile Creek Landfill for their most recent expansion was likely the highlight of last year's major accomplishments. There were a lot of people involved in this over the past three years, and each had a hand in this outcome. I'm pleased with this agreement and thankful to those who never gave up and persisted in finding a way to make an acceptable agreement for all of those involved. The largest challenge we face in 2023 is similar to what we are all facing: the rising cost of goods and services but with little to no budget flexibility. Tax collections in 2023 will be \$7,105 more than in 2022, but we are looking at major increases in every area of our budget, especially road maintenance. We plan very carefully in this area and there are trickle down effects if we fall behind or just "cut back" because once you do that, it becomes nearly impossible to catch back up again. A trend we continue to see at the state level is the use of grant dollars, rather than state aid, to help pay for budget items - anything from major road projects to new equipment and other capital expenses outside of the day to day budget. Grants always involve matching funds, (so they are not free,) and always involve competing with our own neighboring townships for the limited state or federal funds available. It's an ongoing challenge that we will see exponentially increase in the coming years, unless legislation decides otherwise.

Weather plays a role in our budget as well, with this year's weather patterns certainly making things more difficult. The large snowfall in mid-December called for extra time clearing trees and downed power lines, while the next month gave us nothing but ice. Our salt/sand budget will need some modifications to accommodate what only Mother Nature can predict, but we will continue to do the best we can. We are incredibly fortunate to have two of the hardest working road crew, but we'd always appreciate a few more qualified relief drivers if you ever feel inclined to get trained up.

Rounding out the next few months, we have an ATV public meeting on the agenda for February 16th at 6 p.m. at the Town Hall to discuss opening town roads to ATVs. Please plan to attend if you have interest in this.

The weather will be getting warmer before we know it! Until then, enjoy all that our Wisconsin seasons have to offer.

DOG LICENSES

Don't forget your 2023 Dog License! All dogs in the State of Wisconsin are required to be licensed. Town of Seymour dog licensing fees are **\$8.00 for spayed or neutered dogs and \$20 for unaltered dogs.**

2022 Dog tags expired on December 31, 2022. For dogs we have on record, you were sent a written reminder/notice in December. Have a new dog or new to the Town of Seymour, the Dog License application is on our website.

Licenses are only issued if you have a current rabies vaccination for your dog. Please work with your vet to get your dog vaccinated. Late fees will be imposed for any animal not licensed by March 31, 2023. Citations will be issued if your dog is unlicensed after June 1, 2023.

Please be a responsible pet owner. When walking your dog, keep your dog on a leash and pick up after your dog.

WHAT IS STORM WATER RUNOFF?

Storm water runoff is rain and melting snow that flows off building rooftops, driveways, lawns, streets, parking lots, construction sites, and industrial storage yards. Developed areas are covered by buildings and pavement, which do not allow water to soak into the ground. Storm sewers are used to collect large amounts of runoff from streets and parking lots. Do Your Part, Be Septic Smart:

Routine maintenance and inspection are required for all septic systems in Eau Claire County. This helps to ensure they are operating correctly and can identify or prevent failures. We send reminders to homeowners when a routine inspection is due. Most systems require service every three years (some unique systems may require service up to every 3 months). Make sure to submit a septic tank maintenance report to the Health Department, if you have your tank pumped before you receive a notice. The pumping reports must be returned to the Health Department.

D0:

- Flush toilet paper only
- Use water efficiently and stagger use of water-based appliances
- If you have a private well, have it tested regularly to ensure a failing septic system isn't contaminating your water
- Have your system professionally inspected and pumped per requirements

DON'T:

- Park vehicles or plant trees on your drainfield
- Pour grease, fats, harmful chemicals down your drain
- Flush feminine hygiene products, diapers, hair, wipes, medicine, or
- Flush feminine hygiene products, diapers, hair, wipes, medicine, or trash
