As we head into this summer, we'll be planning our next Seymour Town Picnic for August 21st. This year, we hope to be back outside with less than 100 degree temps! Each year, this picnic is made possible by donations from the businesses that call Seymour home. From Your Board Supervisor

I hope you survived the "Winter that didn't exist" as well as I did. I was quite pleased when my Xcel Energy gas bills showed up!

Normally our Road Crew brushes the road rights-of-way in the fall and early spring. Unfortunately, the mower on our tractor had a catastrophic failure, and couldn't be repaired. We ordered a new mower deck and hydraulic arm last October to the tune of \$30,000+. As of this writing, we have not received the new parts. The last estimate for delivery was May of this year. Of course, this was the perfect winter to be able to do a lot of brushing.

We are embarking on a large road project this year. If you travel on 140th Ave over the bridge at Beaver Creek, you understand how poorly designed that bridge and approaches are. There are also some erosion issues taking place. In 2022 we applied for and were awarded a partial grant to replace the bridge and improve the approaches. We have hired an engineering firm to design the project and are hoping to seek bids to complete the project, very soon.

The 140th Ave bridge project is in addition to our normal annual road work. We are currently accepting bids to rebuild 140th Ave from CTH Q (Olson Dr) to Rossman Dr., as well as Oak Knoll Dr from CTH K (130th Ave) to 140th Ave. Hopefully we don't have the "Summer that didn't exist", with snow in July!

With the HSHS hospitals and Prevea clinics closing, Emergency Medical Service (EMS) in the area is going through some changes. I was at a meeting with representatives from both Mayo and Marshfield hospitals recently. Both hospitals are updating their protocols to better provide for the influx of patients. EMS in the field (Emergicare & Eau Claire FD ambulance) should remain relatively the same.

Enjoy the summer. Talk to you again in the fall.

DOG LICENSE REMINDER

There are still about 75 dogs that are unlicensed for 2024. Please remember that all dog tags expire on December 31^{st} each year. If your dog is caught running loose and doesn't have a current tag, you could receive a citation from the EC Humane Assoc. Please, get those dogs licensed! As of April 1^{st} , there is a \$5.00 per tag late fee assessed. If you are sending it in the mail, include a self-addressed stamped envelope for the return of your dog tag.

WHAT IS STORMWATER POLLUTION?

Stormwater pollution refers to many types of harmful materials that are carried by water (rainwater or wash water or snow melt) through the storm drain system to creeks, open ditches, rivers, and lakes. **Stormwater is not treated in any way**.

While water we use in our homes and businesses drain to your private septic systems, stormwater, and anything else dumped or spilled outside flows into the storm drain system and directly to our waterways. Stormwater pollution has many sources. One of the most common is illegal dumping or spilling of wastes directly into storm drains.

Please be careful when doing any burning and remember you need a burn permit from Township Fire every time you burn, and some residents will also need a permit from the DNR. Spring is the most critical fire season in Wisconsin. Warmer temperatures, low humidity and windy days coupled with many landowners conducting spring clean-up around their property by burning yard waste leads to the majority of wildfires.

NEW! Health Department Now Offering Well Water Testing Homeowners Bundles

The Eau Claire Health Department gets MANY questions about what you should test your well water for. So, they created two homeowners bundles to recommend common tests (and save you \$ too!)

- **Homeowners Bundle \$80** includes testing for Bacteria, Nitrate, Lead, Copper, and Arsenic. Recommended for homeowners with private wells, especially if they've never tested for metals before.
- Homeowners Plus Bundle- \$120- includes testing for Bacteria, Nitrate, Lead, Copper, Arsenic, Iron, Manganese, Hardness, Zinc, Cadmium, Cobalt, Chromium, and Nickel. Recommended for homeowners with private wells who want a more complete picture of your water quality.
- Even without a change in color, smell, or taste of the water, many things like bacteria can negatively affect your family's health. Last year at our lab, **nearly 1 in 6** drinking water samples from Eau Claire County private wells had bacteria that can make people sick! If you have a private well, YEARLY tests for bacteria are recommended so you can keep your family healthy. Water test results are for your knowledge only.
