From Your Board Supervisor

WOW! Two winters in-a-row that were milder than average. Except for a stretch in January where we got to experience the Polar Vortex, I'll take it!

An update for you on the multi-use path proposed along McKinley Rd. At a public meeting in January we heard from several people concerning the multi-use path that had been proposed by the City and Counties of Eau Claire. After much discussion, and a show of hands in both support, and opposition, only two people in attendance opposed the multiuse path. At the conclusion of the meeting, the Town Board voted to agree to pursue the multi-use path and contribute a little over \$2,300 to the cost.

Another much larger project is in the works from Excel Energy. What they are calling the "Western Wisconsin Transmission Connection" is a proposed 345-kilovolt transmission line to expand the region's transmission grid to meet the changing energy needs. A detailed map is available at: www.WWTConnection.com. The proposed route travels north from Blair, WI to what Excel Energy has labelled the "Elk Farm Substation", at the intersection of N. 65th Ave and Burnell Dr in the Town of Seymour. From that point there are two routes being proposed. One going west to the City of Eau Claire, then north to the Jump River Substation North. The other route would go from the Elk Farm Substation north then run parallel to Hwy 29 to the Jump River Substation South. Our bridge replacement project on S. 140th Ave has had several delays/roadblocks. Because of this the estimated cost of the project has skyrocketed. In 2022 we applied for and were awarded a partial grant to replace the bridge and improve the approaches. With the estimated cost so high now, we will likely have to put the project on hold until additional grants become available.

We will soon be looking for bids on roadwork for 2025. The reconstruction projects are Peterson Ave (Tower Dr to N. Shore Dr), Woodhaven Rd & Lassek Ct, and a portion of Vance Rd west of N. 84th Ave to the Town of Hallie line on top of the hill.

Finally, I would like to express my gratitude to our outgoing Town Chair Jessica Janssen. The Town has greatly benefited from your dedication to your duties as Chair. I wish you luck in your future endeavors.



Even without a change in color, smell, or taste of the water, many things like bacteria, nitrate, and metals can negatively affect your family's health. Last year at our lab, nearly 1 in 6 drinking water samples from Eau Claire County private wells had bacteria that can make people sick! If YOU have a private well. YEARLY tests for at least bacteria and nitrate are recommended so you can keep your family healthy. Water test results are for your knowledge only. If you water result is unsafe, you can decide to treat your water or not.
